MRSA IN PETS

This is a serious bacterium that can affect all companion animals

It is important to detect symptoms of post-operative or skin infections early so that treatment can be started immediately

Does your pet exhibit the clinical signs of MRSA?

KNOW WHAT TO LOOK FOR:

The signs of MRSA infection are the same as those of other staphylococci infections.

They include:

DISCHARGE OR INFLAMMATION FROM A SURGICAL WOUND;

A WOUND THAT IS NOT HEALING AND NOT

RESPONDING TO REGULAR TREATMENT;

RAISED TEMPERATURE;

RAISED WHITE BLOOD CELL COUNT:

LOSS OF APPETITE AND EXTREME LETHARGY;

DEPPRESSED Demeanor

IF YOU SEE THESE SIGNS IN YOUR PET SEEK IMMEDIATE VETERINARY ADVICE.

IT MAY BE NECESSARY TO TAKE A SWAB
